Based at UCL Great Ormond Street Institute of Child Health (GOS ICH), ISOSS carry out the national monitoring of HIV, syphilis and hepatitis B in pregnant women and children. Long-term paediatric HIV surveillance is carried out by the Children's HIV and AIDS Reporting System (CHARS) for NHS England and NHS Improvement and the UK Health Security Agency's National Infection Service. Also based at GOS ICH, CHARS follows all children and young people living with HIV who access paediatric services in England.

Speakers Biographies

Mesfin Ali, Embrace UK

Mesfin Ali was born and studied in Ethiopia. He is currently Health Services Manager at Embrace UK Community Support Centre and has been working in health-related areas, particularly around HIV, for over 30 years.

Mesfin has experience of delivering and managing HIV services at Embrace UK since 1997. He has a background in medical statistics and public health, and is also a qualified psychodynamic counsellor.

Lieutenant Commander Oli Brown, Royal Naval Officer and HIV Advocate, Royal Navy

Oli was diagnosed with HIV in 2019 after an incident with 'a bike, a bottle and a brick wall' led to him attending CHELWEST A&E, where he was diagnosed through an Opt-Out HIV trial. Since then he has had to face the all too familiar challenges of stigma, mental health and living with HIV – not to mention serving in the Armed Forces with HIV One year after diagnosis, and after a series of happy coincidences, Oli started to support THT, BHIVA, BASHH and NAT in challenging the Ministry of Defence on their policies on PrEP, entry and services restrictions. Estimating it could take 3-4 years to achieve a result, Oli chose to speak publicly, ultimately driving the policy change through in just under eight months. However, at the same time he coincidentally, but consciously, sabotaged his own future career as a Warfare Officer where his HIV status would result in international travel restrictions.

Thokozani Chibowa, Chiva Associate

Thoko Chibowa has been an active Chiva associate who hybrid works within the charity. From running mental health and well-being workshops, to providing 1-1 support for vulnerable young people, to supporting camp as a camp leader supervisor and leading ART is key projects. Thoko's passions on providing quality peer support for CHIVA's young people has been at the core of her work. With an experienced background in counselling and psychotherapy, clinical research as well as peer support, Thoko is committed to ensure young people at CHIVA feel empowered. That even though living with HIV is complicated, there's always room to explore their stories in a safe supported place. That no matter what a young person may go through, they'll always feel like they matter, and their life is rich.



Dr Claire Dewsnap, BASHH President, BASHH & Sheffield Teaching Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust

Claire was appointed as a consultant in 2007 in Sheffield and became clinical lead in 2009. She has led in a number of roles, including clinical lead across two departments and lead for quality improvement across Outpatient services. Claire has had a number of roles in education including Dip GUM examiner, Foundation TPD and lead for Blackboard roll out in Yorkshire and Humber foundation school. Research interests include management of bacterial STIs and online testing. Organisational areas of interest included change implementation, quality and service improvement and teaching and training. She has led and been involved in numerous quality improvement and change implementation projects within the field both strategically and operationally. Claire became BASHH conference and communication chair in 2018. Claire is the current BASHH President.

Dr Jake Dunning, Consultant in Infectious Diseases, Royal Free London NHS Foundation Trust/University of Oxford

Jake Dunning is a Consultant in Infectious Diseases at the Royal Free Hospital, London, Honorary Consultant in Reference Virology at UKHSA, and Senior Research Fellow at the Pandemic Sciences Institute, University of Oxford. His clinical, public health and research work focusses on emerging infections, respiratory virus infections, and High Consequence Infectious Diseases. He leads the Airborne and Contact HCID services at the Royal Free Hospital, including the High Level Isolation Unit, and is Director of the NHS England Network for Contact HCIDs. His research covers disease characterisation, transmission, diagnostics, environmental sampling, infection prevention and control, viral kinetics, and pathogenesis of severe disease. He has been involved in clinical trials of experimental treatments for Ebola virus disease, Lassa fever, COVID-19, and influenza. In 2018, Jake diagnosed the first case of travel-associated monkeypox to be reported in Europe. For monkeypox, Jake is involved in trials and studies of tecovirimat in Europe and in Africa, along with studies characterising severe disease, assessing environmental contamination of healthcare settings, and measuring immunological responses and reactogenicity in smallpox vaccine recipients. He is a member of the WHO IHR Emergency Committee for monkeypox, a member of the UKHSA Technical Advisory Group for monkeypox, and previously was Head of Emerging Infections and Zoonoses at Public Health England.



Florence Eshalomi, MP for Vauxhall and Co-Chair of the All Party Parliamentary Group HIV and AIDS

Florence Eshalomi was elected MP for Vauxhall in 2019. Vauxhall is one of the highest prevalence areas of HIV in the UK.

Florence has since campaigned on issues such as support for PrEP, funding to fight HIV across the world, the need for an ambitious HIV Action Plan in England and blood donation rights.

She currently serves as Shadow Parliamentary Secretary to the Cabinet Office as well as being a member of the Housing, Communities and Local Government Committee and the Joint Committee on Human Rights. Florence previously severed as an AM for Lambeth and Southwark between 2016 and 2021 and as a Lambeth councillor between 2006 and 2018.

Florence joined the APPG as a member when she was elected in 2019 and became a Vice Chair in March 2021 and in November 2021 became a co-chair.

During her time as a member of the APPG she has been a strong advocate for ensuring that no body is left behind in the HIV Response.

Liz Foote, Clinical Services Manager, CHT HIV and ME, Sussex Community Foundation NHS Trust

Liz started working in the area of HIV 30 years ago. She started her career in HIV at Addenbrookes hospital, Cambridge, on their Infectious diseases unit and then moved to Mildmay Hospital in London. At this time much of her work was palliative. It was an honor and a privilege to look after her patients. She then went on to work as a HIV nurse in Phnom Penh, Cambodia for three years between 2002-2005. She helped support a team of Cambodian nurses and was involved in a HIV community home care project in the slums where they had approximately 350 HIV positive patients on their list at any one time. The three years were incredibly hard, witnessing people die in the most inhumane and raw ways, but extremely rewarding too. She worked as a Macmillan nurse for four years then worked as the clinical team leader for the community HIV nurse specialist team in Liverpool where she looked after complex patients with HIV. In August 2020, she started her new post as Clinical Services Manager for Sussex Community NHS Foundation Trust managing three community specialist services, the Community HIV specialist service, the Chronic Fatigue syndrome/ME service and the carers health team. She has a Masters in Drug Use and Addiction and is a Non-Medical prescriber. She believes in equity for all people and is passionate about working with vulnerable and stigmatized groups.



Mrs Alison Grant, Pharmacist, Guy's & St. Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust

Ali is a senior pharmacist at Guy's and St. Thomas' Foundation Trust and has been working within HIV medicine since 2005. She is a member of the BHIVA guidelines subcommittee as well as BASHH clinical effectiveness group. She has a special interest in patient activation and patient centred care. She has completed an MSc in public health (health promotion) at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine

Dr Joe Heskin, Specialist trainee in GU/HIV Medicine, Chelsea and Westminster Hospital NHS Foundation Trust

Dr Joseph Heskin is a specialist trainee in GU/HIV Medicine at Chelsea and Westminster Hospital and was the clinical lead on the BHIVA/BASHH campaign to end the ban on people living with HIV from joining the military. He is a Research Fellow with the Chelsea and Westminster Infectious Diseases Research Group looking at Monkeypox, and COVID-19 diagnostics, and is an Honorary Research Fellow with BASHH and UKHSA looking at STI surveillance data in UK prisons.

Steve Hindle, Project Manager Opt out HIV testing, NHS England

Steve Hindle is the Project Manager for Opt out HIV testing at NHS England. Prior to this he worked at the Elton John AIDS Foundation as the Social Impact Bond performance manager for the Zero HIV programme, implementing HIV testing and reengagement of those lost to care in acute, primary care and community settings in South East London. He has an extensive background in the health care charity sector in working in partnership with the NHS to design and implement service development and quality improvement.

Fiona Marra, Lead Pharmacist HIV/HCV FRPharmS (Consultant), NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, and University of Liverpool, UK

Fiona Marra is RPS accredited Consultant Pharmacist in Infectious Disease and Hepatology. She is Clinical Lead and part of the Editorial Board of the University of Liverpool, Drug Interactions websites, where she writes the content. She works clinically in Glasgow where is Lead Clinician for paediatric Infectious Disease for Scotland and senior pharmacist for adult HIV/HCV.

Fiona is completing a PhD in Clinical Pharmacology and has completed diplomas in international development and travel medicine and a MSc in Advanced Pharmacy. Fiona sits on the Committees of the British HIV Association (BHIVA) Hepatitis Group, the Scottish Malaria Group and is part of the Editorial board of Scottish paediatric Infection and Immunology network (SPAIIN). She is an author of the EASL Recommendations for HCV 2018 and 2020 and lectures globally on HIV and HCV drug interactions.



Dr Kate Nambiar, Medical Director, Terrence Higgins Trust

Dr Kate Nambiar is a sexual health and gender identity physician who has worked in the NHS since 1999 and been involved in activism for the trans community. She began her career as a sexual health & HIV physician and has spent the largest proportion of that time working in Brighton. A large proportion of her work has focussed on trans healthcare, and she is passionate about improving healthcare for trans people everywhere. In 2012 she co-founded Clinic T, a sexual health service for trans and gender diverse people based in Brighton. She now works as a Gender Clinician and Endocrinology Specialist at the Welsh Gender Service, Cardiff and Vale University Health Board and as the medical director for Terrence Higgins Trust.

Dr Will Nutland, Co-Director, The Love Tank/PrEPster

Will Nutland is a health and social justice activist, researcher, and health promoter. He's worked in community-based HIV prevention for over 25 years, including as Head of Health Promotion at the UK's Terrence Higgins Trust. In 2008, Will joined the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine to undertake a doctorate in public health and he is an Honorary Assistant Professor at the School where he teaches in health promotion, and applied communicable disease control. With an interest in communitybased research and health equity, his research areas have included the acceptability and implementation of HIV PrEP in London; and research into "do-it-yourself" HIV prevention and how generic PrEPis sourced outside of established health systems. In 2015 he co-founded PrEPster – a grass roots group that educates and advocates for access to PrEP. He is the co-founder and a director of The Love Tank Community Interest Company (www.thelovetank.info) - a health promotion non-profit company. In 2022, Will's activism, research and health promotion turned to the global monkeypox outbreaks. This work has included organising under-the-radar pop-up vaccination hubs; advising ECDC, WHO and UKHSA; and undertaking community-based research in partnership with the SHARE Collaborative at Queen Mary University, London.

Dr Matthew Page, Consultant Physician in Sexual Health & HIV Medicine, University Hospitals Birmingham, NHS Foundation Trust

Matthew Page is a newly qualified Consultant in Sexual Health and HIV Medicine at University Hospitals Birmingham. He is the current chair of the BHIVA External Relations committee, vice-Chair of the BHIVA Conferences committee, and was on the BHIVA Executive committee as the Doctor in Training representative (from Feb 2020-Feb 2022). His interests are in HIV therapies, PrEP and sexual health in MSM.



Linda Panton, Senior Charge Nurse, NHS Lothian

Linda Panton began her career in HIV nursing in the Regional Infectious Diseases Unit in Edinburgh nearly 30 years ago. Her first post was a staff nurse in the HIV unit and then she moved into the role of HIV clinical nurse specialist. She continues to see patients in this capacity and is also senior charge nurse of the outpatient department. She is passionate about improving HIV services and outcomes and helped set up NHS Lothian Patient Forum. She strives to ensure equity of care for all those living with HIV, and her main objective is to drive nurse-led holistic care for stable patients in her unit. She has served on the NHIVNA Executive since 2013 and has been Treasurer since 2015. She was recently presented with the 2022 NHIVNA HIV Nurse of the Year award.

Silvia Petretti, CEO, Positively UK

Silvia Petretti is Positively UK's CEO, a national charity lead and run by people with HIV, which uses peer support to improve health and quality of life. Silvia believes that a key tool in defeating HIV stigma is for people with HIV to be heard, visible and involved in decisions that affect them. She firstly joined Positively UK in 1999, when Positively UK was still known as Positively Women, as a volunteer in the organisation Community Development Team providing treatment information to women attending HIV clinics. Soon she became a staff member leading on support for women with drug and alcohol issues and providing outreach in Holloway prison. Silvia is the co-author of the SHE+ toolkit (Strong HIV Positive and Empowered), which aimed at supporting women with HIV in Europe to deliver women centred peer support. Silvia is a member of the WHO advisory board on Women and HIV and has worked as part of a team to develop a global toolkit for women with HIV to access their Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights. Silvia has been living with HIV 25 years.

Jonathan Roberts, Senior HIV screening co-ordinator/CNS, University Hospitals Sussex NHS Trust

Jonathan started his career in HIV and sexual health over 20 years ago. He initially worked in Sexual Health & HIV as a Junior Nurse in Guys and St Thomas's and then at Barts and the Royal London. He then worked as a Senior Nurse in HIV Research care in Barts and the London before moving to Brighton in 1999. In Brighton he worked as a Community Nurse Specialist in HIV for 4 years before moving back to Hospital base care as a Liaison Health Advisor in 2003. In 2007 he worked part- time in this post and also part time as a Senior Lecturer in Sexual Health & HIV at the University of Brighton. He moved to Wales to work as a Senior Nurse in HIV/ Integrated sexual health but returned to Brighton in 2017 to work as Nurse Team Leader in HIV outpatient care. Currently he now co-ordinates the HIV screening programme at the Royal Sussex County Hospital, along with working part-time as a CNS in HIV care.



Dr Sarah Rutter, Clinical Psychologist, North Manchester General Hospital

Sarah Rutter is a Clinical Psychologist and is the Psychology Lead in the HIV Service at North Manchester General Hospital. Sarah was also chair of the British Psychological Society's HIV and Sexual Health Faculty for four years and continues to sit on the committee. She has been involved in, and has often co-facilitated various projects within the field of HIV, including the writing and updating of national care standards, audit of the HIV psychological standards, and the development of a psychological support training package for healthcare professionals working within HIV. She has also coedited and contributed to books relating to the topics of psychological care in HIV. She is an honorary lecturer at the University of Liverpool, and provides HIV specific teaching and training to Trainee Clinical Psychologists across the North West region and HIV and sexual health services across the UK.

Alex Sparrowhawk, Partnerships Coordinator, Terrence Higgins Trust

At Terrence Higgins Trust, Alex leads on HIV Prevention England's work to build strategic partnerships across the health system and with key stakeholders, and supports capacity and skills development within the HIV and sexual health sector. During 2022, Alex has led THT's response to the monkeypox outbreak, coordinating health promotion efforts to raise awareness of the virus, and how the community could protect themselves, utilizing existing partnerships across the sector to collectively engage communities most likely to acquire monkeypox.

Alex also Chairs the UK Community Advisory Board (UK-CAB, the HIV Treatment Advocates Network). Alex is passionate about developing meaningful partnerships with key stakeholder groups across the sector, including people living with and affected by HIV.

Sophie Strachan, CEO, Sophia Forum

Sophie is CEO of the Sophia Forum which exists to empower all women living with HIV to reach their full potential, and to ensure their voices are heard and their needs prioritized within the health sector and wider society.

Sophie has been an advocate for women and HIV for almost 2 decades ensuring gender visibility and health equity in the HIV response and that women's sexual reproductive health and rights are achieved. She has provided policy advice to public health organizations, NHS England, NICE, NGOs and academics, WHO and UN Women advocating both nationally and internationally. Her research as an associate consultant in the last year has addressed women's experience of incarceration in the UK whilst living with HIV.



Dr Shema Tariq, Senior Clinical Research Fellow and Honorary Consultant in HIV and Sexual Health, UCL Institute for Global Health

Shema Tariq is a clinical academic at UCL's Institute for Global Health and Consultant in HIV at Mortimer Market Centre, where she developed and leads their HIV and menopause service. Shema is Chief Investigator of the PRIME Study, one of the largest studies internationally of HIV and menopause and is a proud member of the GROWS Project team.

Dr Lauren Walker, Senior Clinical Lecturer in Clinical Pharmacology & Therapeutics, University of Liverpool

Lauren Walker is Clinical Senior Lecturer in Clinical Pharmacology & Therapeutics at University of Liverpool. She contributes to outpatient clinics, inpatient reviews and multidisciplinary team meetings for adults with complex multimorbidity & polypharmacy. She chairs a National Polypharmacy Services Consortium (PPSC), a collaborative venture between Clinical Pharmacologists, Pharmacists, Geriatricians and GPs to develop an integrated service model and a unified, sustainable approach to improving polypharmacy, through multidisciplinary collaboration across primary and secondary care. She is co-lead for the NIHR-funded DynAIRx Programme, developing new, easy to use, artificial intelligence (AI) tools that support GPs and pharmacists to systematically identify problematic polypharmacy in major multimorbidity groups. She has codeveloped a machine learning approach to identify disease and prescribing trajectories in people with complex care needs, utilizing existing health records (www. SERENDIP.org.uk).

Lauren is also an experienced first-in-human investigator and one of the senior investigators for the Agile trial (https://www.agiletrial.net/), the only UK Government-funded early-phase trial platform for Covid-19 therapeutics.

Dr Laura Waters, Mortimer Market Centre, London

Dr Laura Waters is a GU/HIV consultant and HIV & hepatitis lead at The Mortimer Market Centre, London. She is chair of the British HIV Association (BHIVA), chair of the BHIVA treatment guidelines and prior secretary & chair of the Conferences Subcommittee. She is a trustee of the British Association of Sexual Health & HIV (BASHH) & chairs or co-authors other national guidelines. Laura represents BHIVA on the HIV CRG, advising NHS England on HIV treatment and care. She has published and presented widely, writes a regular column for Boyz magazine and is a Terrence Higgins Trust trustee. She works with JUSTRI, an HIV charity, to deliver training on HIV & Sexual Health to medical students & teaches on HIV courses for University College London and the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine. Dr Emma Williams, Specialty Registrar Infectious Diseases/Microbiology, Sheffield Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust




