## OBJECTIVES

Explore areas where collaborative initiatives are deemed to be of benefit to promote clinical excellence

Activity will include:

- Joint consultation responses
- Collaborative input into relevant guidelines
- Joint scientific and / or fundraising events, such as to mark World AIDS Day
- Joint publication of press releases on agreed topics

Activities will be task-oriented and will work only on issues where a combined voice is useful

## ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Members will represent their own organisation on the FHIVA Steering Committee and liaise with the own committees

Liaison with community organisations through UK Community Advisory Board (UK-CAB)

Each organisation will take on the role of FHIVA chair on a rotational basis

## GOVERNANCE

Steering Committee is made up of the chairs or their nominated representatives of the seven organisations

Chair of the Steering Committee will rotate around each organisation every 2 years

FHIVA will not engage in activity that could jeopardise the charitable status of any of the Parties

## FUNDING

FHIVA will be funded by BHIVA for the first 2 years

FHIVA might make applications to key funders and sponsors

Any applications will not be detrimental to fundraising for any of the individual organisations
