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## Networks and networking

- Network: *a group or system of interconnected people or things*
- Networking: *interact with others to exchange information and develop useful contacts*
- Key aspects: *patients, players, provision, pathways*
- Future considerations: multi professional; multi specialty, multi intervention, multi focused



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## Why do we need networks for delivery of excellent care?

- Needs of people living with HIV and personalised care
- Local populations affected by HIV and prevention
- Nature of HIV and role of LTC management
- Organisational boundaries – levers and obstacles
- Describing interconnections – for everyone



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## Where are we now?

- Service specifications for networked HIV care for adults and children based on BHIVA / CHIVA standards
- Compliance exercise and derogations - challenge of network arrangements
- Mature networking, more to do to formalise networks
- Period of reflection and development e.g. MONHICA
- Evolving ambitions - from HIV Networks to networks of care for people with HIV
- Specification amendments and co-commissioning
- Consistently addressing roles, pathways, governance, quality, outcomes and information



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## NHS Five Year Forward View (1)

### Key messages

- **Radical upgrade in prevention and public health.**
- **When people do need health services, patients will gain far greater control of their own care**
- **NHS will take decisive steps to break down the barriers in how care is provided.**
- **England is too diverse for a 'one size fits all'** so local health communities supported to choose from amongst a small number of radical new care delivery options e.g. **Multispecialty Community Provider, Primary and Acute Care Systems**
- **National leadership** to support meaningful **local flexibility**
- **Financial challenge** of closing the £30b gap by 2020/2021



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## NHS Five Year Forward View(2)

**Long term conditions** are now a central task of the NHS; caring for these needs requires a partnership with patients over the long term rather than providing single, unconnected 'episodes' of care. As a result there is now quite wide consensus on the direction we will be taking.

- Increasingly we need to manage systems – networks of care – not just organisations.
- Out-of-hospital care needs to become a much larger part of what the NHS does.
- Services need to be integrated around the patient.
- We should learn much faster from the best examples, not just from within the UK but internationally.
- And as we introduce them, we need to evaluate new care models to establish which produce the best experience for patients and the best value for money



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## NHS Five Year Forward View (3)

In services where the relationship between quality and patient volumes is strong, NHS England will now work with local partners to drive consolidation through a programme of three-year rolling reviews.

We will also look to ...**specialised providers** to develop networks of services over a geography, integrating different organisations and services around patients, using innovations such as prime contracting and/or delegated capitated budgets.



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## Future for networks in delivery of excellent care

- Patients need the system to collaborate more than ever
- Partnerships, new care models, innovation, co-commissioning - debates for NHS as a whole, not just HIV
- Translate personal and professional networks into organisational and system ones, that extend across pathway
- Recognised and resourced formalised arrangements to ensure quality and safety
- Defining roles and relationships for collaborative system leadership delivering measurable outcomes
- Delivering the 'what' of specs through the 'how' of local solutions decided by local partners with national support
