Biographies

Ashley Brown graduated BSc, MB ChB from Liverpool Medical School. He undertook postgraduate training in hepatology in Newcastle-upon-Tyne where he was awarded an MD for research into the pharmacogenetics of alcohol metabolism. He worked as a consultant on liver units in Australia and the UK before taking up his current position at Imperial College Healthcare in 2002. He has a major clinical interest in viral hepatitis and is currently conducting a number of studies into novel therapies for HBV and HCV.

James Coutts trained at Oxford University Medical School, with medical qualification in 1989. He became a member of the Royal College of Physicians by examination in 1992, and subsequently a fellow in 2006. After training in general medicine he undertook three year's training in Intensive care, before specialising in cardiology. He was appointed consultant cardiologist at Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals in 2002. He has a specialist interest in coronary intervention (angiography and angioplasty for ischaemic heart disease), in addition to working in general cardiology and general medicine.

Gillian Dean Following training in London, Brighton and Kwazulu-Natal, Dr Dean was appointed GUM/HIV Consultant in Brighton in 2001. She set up the first UK New-fill service in March 2002, which is now a nurse-led service. Her interests include sexual health education in primary care, outreach testing for STIs and research into simplifying outpatient PID treatment.

Sarah Doffman is a Respiratory Physician at Brighton and Sussex University Hospital. Her specialist interests include lung cancer, TB and respiratory disease in the immunocompromised host. She is extensively involved in both clinical work and research in respiratory disease in the setting of stable HIV infection.

Simon Edwards has been a Consultant in GU/HIV Medicine at the Mortimer Market Centre and UCLH since 2000. He is the current Chair of the BASHH HIV Special Interest Group. He was Co-Chair of the BHIVA Guidelines for Opportunistic Infections (2011) and is currently a section lead for the writing group for the upcoming HIV treatment guidelines. He is an examiner for the Diploma HIV. He has previously been on the BHIVA Executive Committee (2005/8).

Yvonne Gilleece is a Consultant in HIV & Genitourinary Medicine at Brighton & Sussex University Hospitals NHS Trust and an Honorary Senior Lecturer at Sussex University. She is the Lead for HIV in Pregnancy and Hepatitis B as well as a clinical supervisor for a PhD on HIV and Bone. She is a member of the BASHH HIV SIG and has been an author on the BHIVA guidelines for Hepatitis and also HIV-2.

Martin Fisher is a Consultant in HIV/GUM at Brighton and Sussex University Hospitals NHS Trust. He is responsible for the outpatient and inpatient management of a large cohort of HIV-infected individuals, and leads an active research team. He is currently an Executive Committee member of the British HIV Association, a member of the HIV Special Interest Group of the British Association for Sexual Health and HIV, and is an examiner and former Convenor of the national Diploma in HIV Medicine. He was Co-Chair of the 2008 UK HIV testing guidelines, as well as being a member of numerous other guidelines committees. His main clinical and research interests are in antiretroviral therapy, primary HIV infection, strategies to improve the diagnosis of HIV infection, HIV and hepatitis co-infection, and the interplay between HIV and other sexually transmitted infections.

Paul Holmes is a liaison general neurologist providing a service to departments of the Acute Trust at Guy's & St Thomas' hospitals, mainly through the acute medicine pathway and also in his role as a neurologist with an interest in stroke patients. More recently he has developed an interest in the neurology of HIV infection, most especially HAND.

Rachael Jones is a Consultant in HIV and Sexual Health at the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital, London. Her major interests are the medical complications of HIV and she runs a combined HIV/renal service with the Consultant Nephrologist, Dr Jeremy Levy. She has been involved in writing local and national guidelines on HIV and sexual health.

Biographies

Ranjababu (Babu) Kulasegaram is a Consultant in HIV/GU Medicine at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust and leads the HIV Treatment Advice Clinic with special interests in HIV/hepatitis, Haemophilia/HIV infection, HIV/brain and HIV inpatient management. He is Training Programme Director for the SpRs and is committed to enhancing BHIVA's educational activities through his involvement as a member of the BHIVA Educational and Scientific Committee and E-Learning Working Group. He is on the examining board of Dip HIV. Babu is also Vice Chair of the BHIVA Hepatitis Working Group and an author of the HIV/hepatitis 2010 guidelines.

Jeremy Levy is a Consultant Nephrologist at Imperial College Healthcare NHS Trust, Honorary Senior Lecturer for Imperial College London, Director of Medical Education and clinical tutor for Hammersmith Hospital, and the Head of the London School of Medicine and Medical Specialties for the London Deanery and RCP. He trained in Cambridge, London and Oxford. He has a major clinical and research interests in immune-mediated renal disease (vasculitis, SLE and other glomerulonephritides), HIV and kidney disease and chronic kidney disease, has written textbooks on dialysis and nephrology, and is hugely committed to teaching and training. He's helped to manage the research programmes at Imperial College Kidney and Transplant Institute for glomerulonephritis, vasculitis and SLE.

Sarah McWilliams has been a Consultant Radiologist at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust since 1999. Dr McWilliams' special interest is cross-sectional imaging.

Rob Miller is Reader in Clinical Infection at University College London, Honorary Professor at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and Honorary Consultant at Camden Provider Services NHS Trust and University College London Hospitals NHS Trust. Rob qualified from St George's Hospital Medical School and trained in general medicine, intensive care and respiratory medicine, and in 1991 was appointed Senior Lecturer in Medicine and Genitourinary Medicine at University College London. Clinically, he works on T8, the Infectious Diseases/Tropical Medicine/HIV-inpatient unit at UCL Hospitals, where he also provides a specialist outpatient HIV/TB service. His research interests relate to the effects of HIV on innate immunity and the respiratory complications of HIV infection, particularly *Pneumocystis jirovecii* pneumonia and tuberculosis. He is Royal College of Physicians Tutor and Training Programme Director for Core Medical Training for Camden Provider Services PCT. Rob is Editor-in-Chief of *British Journal of Hospital Medicine* and from 2002 to 2009 was Co-Editor of *Sexually Transmitted Infections*.

Cindy Sethi is a consultant physician at Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust. She has ongoing clinical and research interests in the health service utilisation of ethnic minority populations, genital dermatoses and post-graduate teaching.

Andrew Ustianowski is Consultant in Infectious Diseases at the Monsall Regional Infection Unit, Manchester, which has a cohort of just under 2000 HIV-positive patients. He has been part of guideline writing committees for BHIVA and other bodies, and has given regional and national lectures on HIV and related topics. His main clinical interests are in HIV and tropical medicine.

John Walsh has worked at St Mary's Hospital as a Consultant in HIV & Sexual Health since 2011.

Laura Waters is an Associate Specialist in HIV/GU Medicine at Brighton & Sussex University NHS Trust. She works on several HIV and hepatitis C research trials. She works one day a week on hepatitis C trials at Chelsea and Westminster Hospital where she is completing an MD on ART simplification and switch.

Anthony Wierzbicki is Consultant in Metabolic Medicine and Chemical Pathology and Director of the Lipid Unit at Guy's and St Thomas' Hospitals. He has published 300 papers on atherosclerosis. He has sat on many UK government panels in cardiovascular medicine including for the National Institute of Health and Clinical Excellence.



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
