
Two-stage question developed in collaboration with CliniQ, the LGBT Foundation, and a partnership of other LGB&T organisations.

HIV & AIDS Reporting System



National system for monitoring HIV outpatient care in England


Collects clinical data at every attendance

Gender identity data **may be partially complete**, this is being addressed through continued follow-up with clinics and improved guidance



# Trans people accessing HIV care


**123 trans people** were recorded as accessing HIV care in England in 2017 (0.14% of all people in care)




#### Cascade of HIV care, UK 2017

# Survey of people living with HIV



the national survey of people living with HIV



A representative sample of people living with HIV in England and Wales were invited to complete the survey


4,424 people responded, of whom **39** (0.88%) identified as trans or non-binary

Questions about living with HIV, health service use, met and unmet need, relationships etc.



#### Health and quality of life








#### Delayed or refused healthcare

#### Conclusions

- For the first time we have presented information on trans people accessing HIV care
- Trans and non-binary gender identity may be under-reported by clinicians, improvements in data quality will lead to better representation of trans people in HIV and STI data
- Trans people have high levels of ART uptake and viral suppression
- Trans people reported higher levels of depression and anxiety, stigma in healthcare settings, and worse health overall, which needs to be addressed




